TONIGHT COULD BE DEFENSIVE BATTLE

The Racine Raiders welcome the Capital City Seahawks out of the nation's capitol to Historic Horlick Athletic Field tonight. The Seahawks are coming off of a 12-0 win last week against the Georgia Brigade. The Raiders say idle last week after the Baltimore (MD) Lightning were unable to make the trip, giving Racine a 2-0 forfeit win.

The Seahawks are in their 10th season and their first in the Gridiron Developmental Football League. Last season, their defense pitched nine shutouts in 17 total games and continued that trend last week. Last week, the Seahawks allowed just 74 total yards with just 42 yards coming through the air. Georgia only ran 25 offensive plays in the game.

Cap City's offense piled up 358 offensive yards but only found the end zone twice. Quarterback D'errico Riggins completed 14-of-18 passes for 185 yards and a touchdown. Four running backs combined for 153 yards on the ground, led by Aaron Gaskins and Larry Graham. Rookie backs Artadius Moore and Desean Young also contributed to the rushing totals. Backup quarterback Aaron Caldwell also threw a touchdown pass in the game.

The Raiders look to unveil a refined offense under first-year offensive coordinator Geoffrey Schick. Schick will have plenty of weapons to work with at every skill position as the Raiders offseason recruiting scored them several semi-pro veterans from other teams as well as several rookies that played collegiately. The quarterback room brings back veteran Raiders Mitch Farr and Antoine McKinney and add Andre Locke from the Englewood Birdgang, and Sawyer Schick who played at UW-La Crosse.

The defense will also be bolstered by fresh faces from several former MidStates Football League teams as well as a few rookies. The defensive line should be a particular bright spot for the team. The defensive backfield features the returns of J.D. Hardy and Daquan Smith. The Raiders also picked up Brady Wodack, an all-conference punter from St. Norbert College, to team up with kicker Alex Gonzalez in the kicking unit.

PLAYER PROFILE: HOWARD TRIPLETT

It was 2015 and head coach Wilbert Kennedy had a decision to make about a young running back that showed flashes of greatness but also looked lost at times. His start running back at the time, J.R. Taylor, said he should keep him around and Kennedy did do that.

“Back then I was super young and I didn’t know much especially about being a Raider and playing Raider football,” says Howard Triplett about Coach Kennedy believing in him. “So, now that I’m eight seasons in, I’ve blossomed and I’m ready for my takeoff now.”

Eight seasons later, Triplett has turned into the best running back in the region and has proven himself as such for the past five years since Taylor retired. Now, he’s out to prove he’s the best running back in the country.

“I’m expecting myself to have a big season,” says Triplett. “I’m shooting for an MVP award.”

Triplett is part of a long lineage of great backs in Racine over 70 years. While the team has no official individual career stats prior to 2011, Triplett is within less than 600 rushing yards of surpassing Taylor’s rushing total and less than 900 yards of surpassing his combined rushing and receiving totals while with Racine.

“Consistency was my biggest pet peeve,” says Triplett. “As a rookie, I was inconsistent where I’d have big runs and big games so now I focus on having consistent 100-yard game, consistent 90-yard



game, and catching the ball.”

Triplett has gotten more involved in the passing game over the last four seasons, having double-digit receptions each year. Triplett said he wanted opportunities in the passing game so he went to the coaches and then worked on his pass-receiving skills.

“I made sure I got in the gym and also worked on my catching,” says Triplett. “Then I came to the field and translated it.”

Triplett has put in the work that it takes to be an elite back and looks to translate that to a national stage.



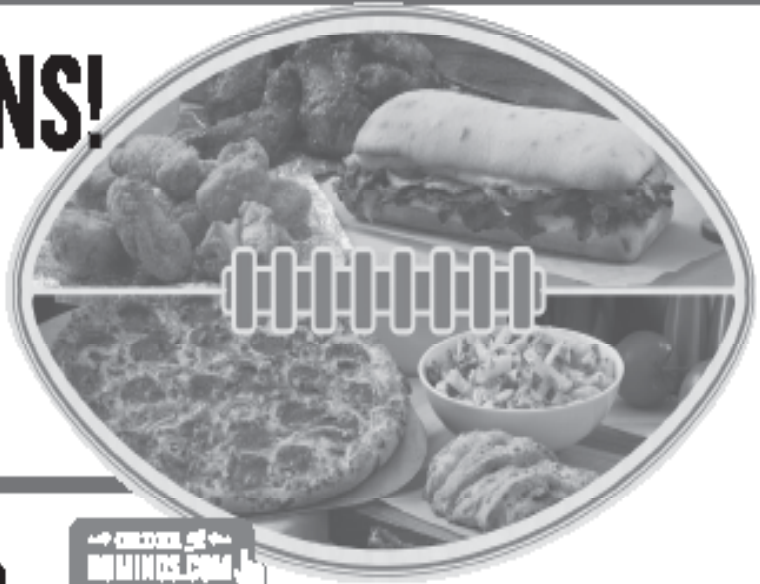

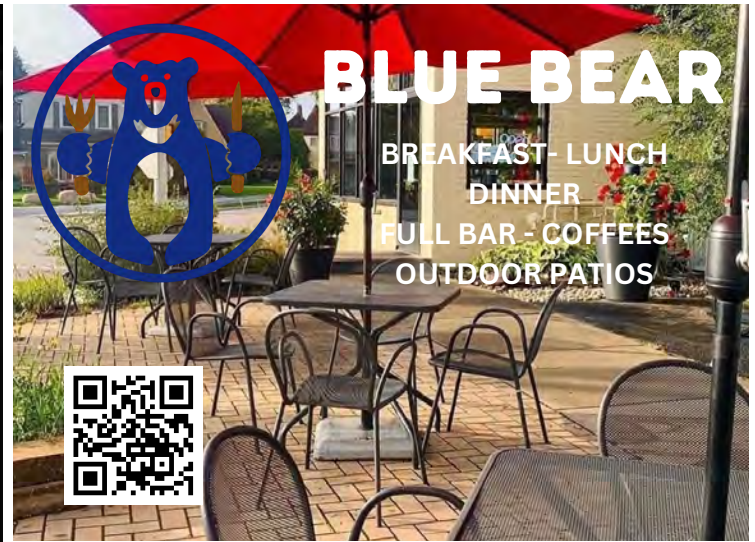

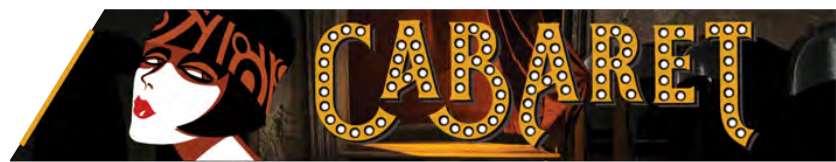
