

RAIDERS FACE THIRD STRAIGHT UNBEATEN OPPONENT

It's another week and another unbeaten opponent staring down the Racine Raiders. After dispatching the Cin City Buccaneers and Indy Bison on the road in back-to-back weeks, the Raiders return home to face the Illinois Cowboys (7-0). The Cowboys are one of two unbeaten teams in the Northern Lights Football League. The other? The Raiders opponent next week, the River City Rough Riders.

The Raiders defense has allowed just 11 points in four games played on the field and haven't allowed a point in the second half of any game this season. They face a familiar foe in the Cowboys, who were previously members of the MidStates Football League. Like the Raiders, the Cowboys have a lot of new faces with many teams south of the state border folding up shop in the offseason.

While astute Raiders fans will notice multiple-time MSFL most valuable player Tony Powell on the roster, he hasn't been the actual quarterback for the Cowboys. Instead, semi-pro veteran Rance Hughes has been the signal caller and he currently leads the NLFL in passing yards (731) and is second in touchdown passes (8).

The Cowboys have two of the top four rushers in the league as well. Devon Sanders is third in the league with 430 yards on the ground while Devion Hodges is fourth with 318 yards. Hodges leads the league in rushing yards per game with 106. Sanders and Hodges each have scored four touchdowns.

With Hughes leading the league in passing yards, his favorite target, Deonta Stevens, also leads the league in receiving yards with 379 and is third with four touchdown receptions. Marlon Martin has added three touchdown catches of his own.

The Cowboys defense is good as well. Defensive back Reginald Haynes has eight interceptions to lead the league and defensive lineman Vonte Smith has a league-leading ten sacks. Defensive back Corey Dalton has three interceptions and defensive lineman Evan Pegues has five sacks for a team that's allowed 48 points this season.



PLAYER PROFILE: ALEX GONZALEZ



Racine Raiders third-year kicker Alex Gonzalez was a late-bloomer when it came to sports.

"I feel like I was really just not interested," says Gonzalez. "I was always athletic but I didn't go out of my way to ask my parents if I could play for a team."

Gonzalez picked up soccer first because he saw a lot of family playing the sport. He gave football a try as an eighth-grader at Mitchell Middle School.

"They had a middle school league and I was the kicker for that team," he remembers. "It was something that I knew how to do and I liked it." Gonzalez says he didn't continue football after that year until his senior year of high school when he played soccer and football at the same time. Injuries derailed his opportunities, however.

Gonzalez is mostly self-taught when it comes to kicking picking up a lot of tips from YouTube. Raiders athletic trainer Christian Venegas has connected him with an expert and he got to learn alongside former Raiders kicker T.J. Hearn as well.

Gonzalez says he enjoys doing things that reflect his values, including being in college, raising a daughter, and kicking for the Raiders.


"I feel my values tie into all of these in regards to wanting to improve and develop as a person, as an athlete, as a father, as a leader," reflects Gonzalez. "I feel like why not take on this responsibility because I can do it pretty well and see if I can excel in it."

Gonzalez now has a regular kicking routine he does three to four times during the week and has set a high goal for himself on the field.

"I don't want to miss a point," he told us. "You never know if it comes down to it if my kick is the deciding factor for the game, I need to not fail and that's one of my goals is to not fail one of my kicks."

Gonzalez could see himself kicking for the Raiders for awhile.

"I can honestly see myself playing football and kicking for the Raiders for a very long time," Gonzalez says. "It's a nice community, a good team, and not something that's going to tax my body too much."


