RAIDERS FACE TOUGHEST TEST OF SEASON

The Racine Raiders have now handily beaten three straight previously unbeaten opponents with two of those wins coming on the road. During the span, Racine has outscored their opponents 99-11 and have held the teams scoreless for ten straight quarters. The Raiders defense has held opponents scoreless in four of the five games played.

Racine plays it's second straight opponent out of the Northern Lights Football League (NLFL) tonight. The River City Rough Riders have mostly rolled to a 9-0 record, including 7-0 in the NLFL. The Rough Riders beat the Minneapolis Warriors in the first week of their pre-season on April 22, 25-20. It was the first time River City beat the Warriors. They then followed that up with their first win ever against the St. Paul Pioneers, taking them down 19-2. The Rough Riders biggest test came two weeks ago when they traveled to the Madison-area to play the Midwest Warriors. They trailed late in that game but were able to come back and hang on for a 32-30 win to keep their undefeated season alive.

They're coming off of a 92-6 win against the Central Wisconsin Bandits last week in less than three quarters of play, though the Bandits only showed up with about 15 players. They've shut out four of their opponents this season.

Offensively, River City is led by quarterback Nate Samas who has thrown 20 touchdowns on the season to just five interceptions. His two favorite targets have been JiVonte Davis (22-391-6) and Jаланzo Jackson (22-362-9). The Rough Riders leading rusher is Devion Clay, averaging 9.5 yards per carry with three touchdowns.

Defensively, John Goode leads the team with ten sacks, Troy Prill has eight sacks, and James Washington has 6-1/2 sacks. The defense has contributed eight touchdowns with Prill leading the way with two touchdowns. Four different players have a pair of interceptions as the team has 11 total picks.

PLAYER PROFILE: BUBBA REWOLINSKI



“As a coach, he’s always on his game and knows what he’s talking about.”

Rewolinski decided to join the Army a year after graduating high school.

“I was stagnant in life and didn’t feel like I was going anywhere,” reflects Rewolinski. “I took the leap and joined the Army.”

Rewolinski spent 3-1/2 years in the Army and is now part of the National Guard. He learned a lot in that time, matured, and grew as a person.

“The biggest life lesson that I learned in the Army is that everybody is different,” says Rewolinski.

Rewolinski said his football and wrestling background prepared him well for Basic Training and that he didn’t feel it was as bad as he heard because of his conditioning from those sports.

His time in the Army also makes him look at football and other things in life in a different way.

“Any day could be your last day,” says Rewolinski. “So I go hard - 110% every game, every play, every practice - giving your all whether it’s something small, something big, because in the end it’ll help you out.”

That attitude might shine the brightest on special teams where Rewolinski has amassed seven tackles as an offensive player, putting him in the top 15 on the team in tackles on the season.

Bubba Rewolinski has played football for as long as he can remember, even playing on the Racine Gladiators youth team which had current Racine Raiders coaches Geoffrey Schick and Vinnie Scacco as coaches. He also played under former Raiders quarterback and Union Grove High School head coach Craig McClelland.

So, when Scacco text him as he was finishing up his full-time commitment to the United States Army, Rewolinski decided to get back into the game he loves after being away from it for five or six years.

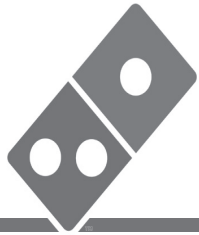
I don’t think anybody dislikes Vinnie,” says Rewolinski.

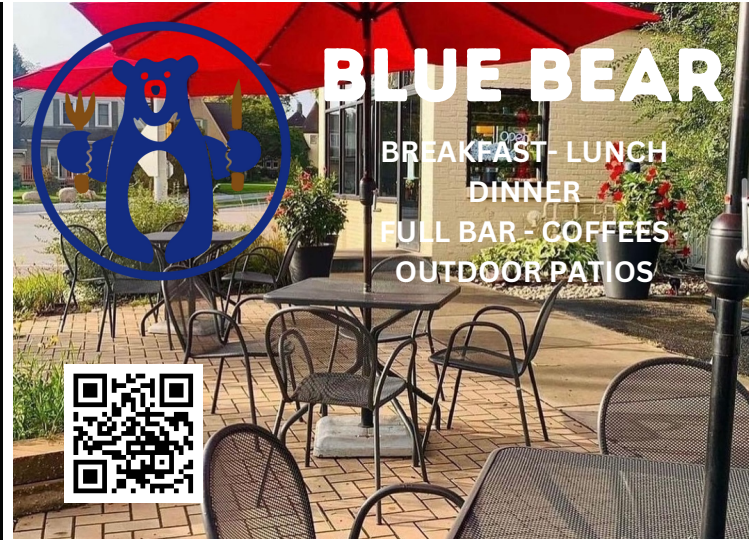
