THE SECOND SEASON BEGINS TONIGHT

The Racine Raiders joined the Gridiron Developmental Football League (GDFL) for this exact reason. The team has a chance to participate in a true national playoff structure with the opportunity to claim the truest national championship in existence in semi-pro football today. If the Raiders can win four more games, they'll extend their all-time semi-pro record to ten national championships.

The 14 teams in the GDFL playoffs represent nine different states - Alabama, Arizona, California, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Tennessee, Washington (state), and Wisconsin. Every team in the GDFL playoffs have won at least one national championship game or bowl championship game. It'll be a tough task to get to Washington, D.C. metro area for the September 2nd GDFL National Championship game and it'll be an even bigger task to beat a dominant West Coast team to lay claim to the Riaders tenth national title.

The road starts tonight as the Raiders host the Tri-City Outlaws, out of the metro Nashville, Tennessee area. The Outlaws finished the season 6-2 and were the seventh-seed in the playoffs in the Xtreme Conference. It's the first time the Raiders played a team from Tennessee since beating the Nashville Storm in the 2012 national championship game right here at Historic Horlick Athletic Field. With a win tonight, the Raiders would then host the winner of the Huntsville (AL) Rockets and Columbus (OH) Fire next week.

Should the Raiders make it to the semi-finals, likely to be played in Syracuse, New York, and hopefully the national championship game, we may be reaching out to the community for some financial support and giving you the opportunity to sponsor a player. More details about that will come out as it becomes relevant.

PLAYER PROFILE: BRADY WODACK



Racine Raiders punter Brady Wodack developed an appreciation for his punting talents but not until his sophomore year at St. Norbert College. Wodack was recruited by the Green Knights primarily as a field goal kicker.

"In high school, I didn't really think punting was my strong suit," Wodack remembers. "I honestly thought that I was a better receiver, defensive back, and kicker than I was a punter."

The change greatly benefited Wodack and St. Norbert as Wodack would be named a first team all-conference punter in his senior season. D3football.com also chose

him for their All-Region 5 Team.

Wodack heard about the Raiders through a co-worker and sent in his film after researching the team.

"It seemed like a great place to continue my playing career after college and get more film out there in hopes of maybe getting a pro opportunity," he said.

Wodack says he wanted to make a positive impact on special teams and be a great teammate and to help bring another national championship to Racine.

He believes things aren't too different from his college playing days other than the practice schedule and the longer road trips..

"In college, you practice almost every day," he says. "Here, you practice only once or twice a week and you have to prepare for games a little more individually."


He says the speed of the game was similar which aided his transition. The community and welcoming teammates also helped him.

"The community support is similar to college since the community at St. Norbert is very involved in the football atmosphere," he says. "Teammates and coaches were very welcoming, making the transition from college to this very easy."

Wodack is finished the regular season averaging just a touch under 40 yards per punt and placed 11 of 26 punts inside the 20-yard line. Wodack has made his only extra point attempt of the year and 11 of his 49 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks.


