TONIGHT'S CONTEST



RAIDERS HERD BILLS TO RECORD FIRST SHUTOUT VICTORY OF 2024

The Racine Raiders (2-0) defense was dominant on the evening of May 18th, recording six sacks and two turnovers while pitching their first shutout of the season, 21-0, over the Michigan Bills (4-2) at Historic Horlick Athletic Field.

While the defense was brilliant, the Raiders offense was inconsistent again, partly due to an underrated Bills defense. While the Raiders offense put up over 330 yards, they were unable to score in the second half. Racine did convert 46% of their third down tries on the night but were 0-for-5 on fourth down conversion attempts.

The Raiders defense was particularly dominant early in the game with the starters playing. They held the Bills to negative total yardage through the first quarter of play. Racine outgained Michigan 219-46 in yards through the first half.

Racine's first score was a 32-yard pass from quarterback Andre Locke, Jr. to tight end Dillon Flores with 5:15 to play in the quarter. Brady Wodack came on for the extra point and connected to make it 7-0. The Raiders would add to their lead on a Locke touchdown pass to H-back Jonata Pike with 13:53 to play in the first half. Wodack again made the extra point and Racine was up 14-0. Locke would score the final touchdown of the game using his legs. With nobody open, Locke stepped up in the pocket and took off down the middle of the field, cutting to his left, and finding the endzone from 11 yards out with 7:06 to go in the first half. The Wodack extra point was again good and it looked like the rout was on. The Michigan defense stepped up after that, allowing Racine to move the ball but holding them out of the endzone the rest of the way.

Tom Benko rushSeven different players carried the rock for the Raiders gaining 127 yards and averaging 4.4 yards per carry as a team. Rashawn Herron paced all the runners with four carries for 44 yards. Locke completed 13-of-25 passes for 194 yards and two interceptions to go with his two passing touchdowns. Joe Garcia again led all receivers with 60 yards receiving. Pike hauled in three catches for 22 yards to go with his touchdown. Nine of the team's 14 completions went to running backs, H-backs, or tight ends as Locke and Schick connected with nine different receivers in the game.

Linebacker Gary Young, Jr. led the way defensively with eight tackles and a sack. Defensive lineman Gage Zahradnik had four tackles, a sack, and a fumble recovery. Linebacker Justin Benko had an interception and safety Jordan Danowski recorded three passes defended for Racine.

Player Profile: Andre Locke, Sr (QB)

Quarterback Andre Locke, Sr. is entering his second season with the Racine Raiders and is coming off a tremendous 2023 season where he totaled over 2,400 yards and 34 touchdowns. Before joining the Raiders in 2023, Locke played for another semi-pro team (Chicago Birdgang) that had two matchups with the Raiders.



After the last of the teams' matchups Raiders head coach Wilbert Kennedy spoke with Locke about his play and the interest both sides had in Locke potentially joining the Raiders.

One of the biggest aspects of Locke joining the Raiders in 2023 is Kennedy's message to his players of becoming a structured player who can adapt and overcome different aspects of the game. This message is something that Locke already followed before his time with the Raiders and is a reason why he joined. "I'm a structured player and what coach Wilbert Kennedy preaches is the same message that I give as a leader," said Locke. Another reason Locke joined the Raiders is due to living in the Chicagoland area. Growing up in the area around the Raiders, Locke had heard and seen many different aspects of Raiders football. One of the biggest aspects for him is the Raiders fan base.

"I've played college and arena football so I promised myself before I was done I'd play and finish as a Raider under the best fan base this level has to offer," Locke stated.

In Locke's first year with the Raiders, they brought home their tenth national championship and Locke received MVP honors from the championship game. In terms of last year's Raiders team and the success they had, Locke gives credit to his coaches and teammates.

"It was an honor to lead our team that far and get our organization back in the national spotlight where we belong," Locke said. "It (a championship) was my main goal for the season and the MVP was the icing on the cake, but a combination of Coach Schick's brain and my whole offense at work. I just got the credit."

Locke's team goals remain the same this season. "The ultimate goal is always the main focus, which is to bring home (championship) number 11," he states. In terms of personal goals, Locke aims to take better care of the ball during the season. "A personal goal of mine is to not throw any interceptions this season," says Locke.

Off the field, Locke is the offensive coordinator at CICS Longwood and coaches baseball at Phillips High School. Locke is proud to help youth carve a positive path in life for themselves. "We have 11-out-of- 11 seniors graduating, and nine are extending their playing career at the next level," brags Locke. "That's honestly why I coach and it's a blessing to be a part of the next generation's future."

Locke is proud to be part of the future of the game and, in typical Locke fashion, even gives credit to teammate Anton Graham. Graham is the head football coach at Racine Case High School and Locke admires the amazing job he's done there.

Locke's commitment to success is evident on and off the field, with coaching youth and leading the Raiders to their first national championship in nearly a decade. The Raiders under Locke can do something that hasn't been accomplished since hall-of-famer Jim May helped lead the team to back-to-back undefeated seasons in 1964 and 1965. May remains the only quarterback in franchise history to have never lost a game.




