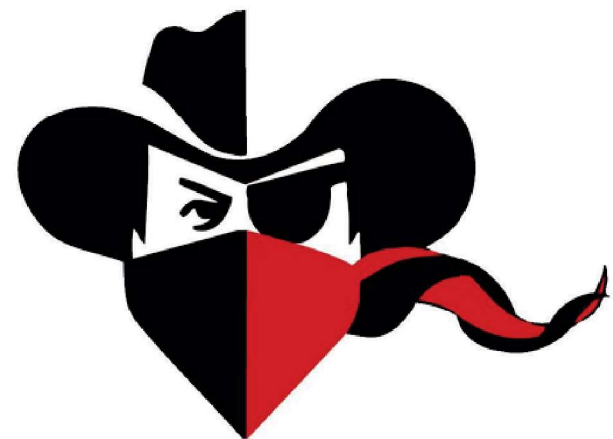

Even Poor Weather Can't Slow Raiders Roll

The Racine Raiders (5-0) dominated once again last Saturday evening, scoring six total touchdowns while shutting out the St. Paul Pioneers (2-5). The Raiders would win 41-0 at Burnsville High School in Minnesota to pick up their 20th straight win between 2023 and this season.

The Raiders' offense kept their momentum from last week's blowout and carried it over to this week's game. The Raiders' offense tallied over 350 total yards while scoring six passing touchdowns in their victory over the Pioneers.

The stellar Raiders defense dominated once again allowing less than 60 total yards of offense while shutting out the Pioneers. The Raiders defense totaled six sacks and two interceptions on the night.

The Raiders' first score came from a 15-yard passing touchdown from Andre Locke to Jashon Foster. Brady Wodack would convert the extra point to make the game 7-0 with 11 minutes left in the first quarter.

After a quick drive by the Pioneers, the Raiders got the ball back at the Pioneers' 25-yard line following a seven-yard punt. After converting a fourth-and-one, Locke connected with Jacques Woodland for an 11-yard touchdown reception. Wodack came on and made the extra point making it 14-0 with just over six minutes remaining in the first quarter.

The Raiders' next score of the game came after an interception by Jordan Danowski which led to the Raiders getting the ball in good field position near midfield. This led to another Raiders score with Locke, as he connected with running back Rashawn Herron for a 16-yard passing touchdown. Wodack would come on to make the game 21-0 with just under six minutes remaining in the second quarter.

The Raiders' defense once again stepped up with Gary Young, Jr. intercepting a Pioneers pass and setting the Raiders up at the Raiders 34-yard line. This led to another Locke passing touchdown where he connected with Ian Gaines for a five-yard touchdown. Wodack would come on to hit the extra point making it 28-0 with just under 30 seconds remaining in the first half.

The Raiders first score of the second half came from a beautiful deep pass from Locke where he found Woodland once again down the sideline for a 39-yard touchdown. Wodack would come on to make it 35-0 with just over eight minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Raiders final score of the game came on a passing touchdown where Sawyer Schick was able to avoid the blitz and find Sean White out of the backfield for a 15-yard touchdown. After a bad snap on the point-after attempt, the score was 41-0 late in the third quarter.

Locke completed 13-of-22 passes for 211 yards and added five passing touchdowns. Schick completed 2-of-2 attempts for 24 yards and a passing touchdown. Tom Benko led all receivers in yards and receptions with three receptions for 57 yards. Woodland led the team in touchdowns with two receptions for 50 yards and two touchdowns. Herron totaled three receptions for 51 yards and one touchdown. White added two receptions for 22 yards and one touchdown.

Herron led the way in rushing with ten attempts for 47 yards followed by Benko who totaled 31 yards on seven attempts. White totaled 20 yards on three attempts and Hayes added 16 yards on three attempts.

Defensive lineman NikoLemke led the way defensively with five tackles, one sack, and two tackles for loss. Gary Young Jr. totaled three tackles and one interception and Danowski also added an interception.

The Raiders host the Flag City Phantoms (6-3) tonight at Historic Horlick Athletic Field with a 7 pm CT kickoff where the Raiders look to tie the 1983-1984 Gladiators with 21 straight wins while also making Wilbert Kennedy the second coach in Raiders history to total 100 wins.

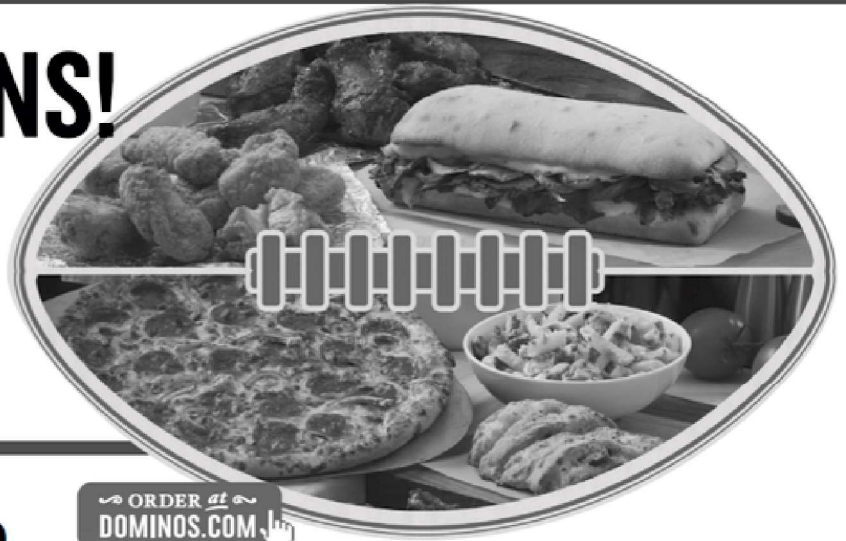

Player Profile:

Gary Young, Jr (LB)

Linebacker Gary Young, Jr. is entering his third season with the Racine Raiders and is coming off of a dominant 2023 season where he totaled 99 tackles, 17 tackles for loss, eight sacks, and three forced turnovers while taking home the honors of Defensive Player of the Year and team Most Valuable Player.

Young's first year with the Raiders was in 2014, when he took home Rookie of the Year honors and the Raiders went undefeated and won the national championship. Playing at a prominent level wasn't something new to Young before joining the Raiders, "I had NFL and CFL workouts prior to my first year, so when I won (ROY) it drove me to work harder because I knew I could play at the next level," Young said

After the 2014 season, Young began moving around to different teams throughout the country in order to gain the most out of his opportunities. Young has played in the AAA league in California for the SoCal Coyotes. After his time with the Coyotes, he joined the Lincoln-Way Patriots and after a few seasons, he joined the TSL summer league playing under former New York Giants linebacker Kevin Morris who Young credits with pushing him to constantly improve and helping him gain connections with other programs and Team USA. In every league that Young has played in he's either won a championship and/or defensive player of the year displaying his talent at a prominent level in leagues around the country.

After his time with the TSL summer league, Young joined the indoor team M3 where he and starting quarterback Andre Locke began a reign of dominance. "With (Locke's) high power offense and my tough nose defense we formed a team that was undefeated," stated Young. After spending over nine seasons with other teams, Young decided that it was time to return home to the Raiders. A large reason for returning to the Raiders was the culture of the organization. "The Raider way led me to return," Young said. "It's a blessing to play for an organization like the Raiders at this level."

On a more personal note, Coach Wilbert Kennedy and other players were a large reason why Young wanted to return. "On a deeper level, what brought me back was Coach Kennedy and former teammates who are still actively playing," said Young. "My first year, (Kennedy) took a long shot with me. I came to camp late and Kennedy usually doesn't accept late arrivals, but he gave me a chance."

“So, my first year I carried a chip on my shoulder to prove he made the right decision to allow me to start as a rookie. And since I started my career here, I wanted to finish my career with the person who gave me my start.”

On Young’s return to the Raiders last season he stated, “It felt great to return to the Raiders. Especially bringing along my guys from Chicago who have the same competitive nature. All we wanted to do was make Racine great again by bringing a steel curtain defense back along with a high-powered offense.”

Young and the Raiders did exactly that bringing home national championship number ten last season. Young’s personal and team goals for this season remain the same.

“I set personal goals to improve myself in the best interest of the team, (and not for) individual accolades,” Young says. “I want to be the best every time I step onto the field for my teammates and coaches.”

“If I win awards again good, but it’s only great if we win a national championship. Team success is my only worry, but awards will follow if I do my job as a leader, teammate, and player.”

The homecoming of Gary Young, Jr. is something that both the team and fans have hoped for ever since he left in 2014. When he finally returned last year, he showed that he not only improved on the field with his stellar defensive play but also off the field in his role as a leader of the defense and team.
