




National Anthem

GAME PREVIEW: Raiders vs St. Paul Pioneers

The Racine Raiders (7-0) host the St. Paul Pioneers (2-6) from the Heartland Football Association this Saturday at Historic Horlick Athletic Field for the teams' second matchup this season. The Raiders, who've dominated opponents all season, are looking to extend their winning streak to 23 games and tie the 1994-95 Raiders for the third-longest winning streak in franchise history. The Pioneers are looking to end their regular season with a monumental upset. The Raiders will look to do something neither team has done in the series between the two rivals, win five straight games.

The Raiders are once again coming off a dominant performance where they shut out the River City Rough Riders 30-0. The Raiders are led offensively by quarterback Andre Locke, Sr. who averages just under 170 passing yards a game while averaging 2.5 passing touchdowns per game. Wide receiver Will Norwood leads the way with an average of 18.4 yards per reception while hauling in a team-leading five touchdowns on the season. The Raiders running backs are usually handled by a "committee" approach and leading the way is Rashawn Herron who has just over 300 rushing yards on 6.4 yards per carry with six rushing touchdowns on the season.

Racine's defense averages only 4.5 points allowed per game while forcing just over two turnovers a game. The Raiders are led defensively by linebacker Gary Young, Jr. who has 43 tackles, 11 tackles for loss, and three interceptions including one returned for a touchdown. Ronald Haggins leads the defensive line with four sacks, 12 tackles for loss, and two forced fumbles. Leading the secondary is Jordan Danowski with 21 tackles and four interceptions including one returned for a touchdown.

The Pioneers are coming off a disappointing game losing 34-0 to the Omaha Stockmen. The Pioneers are led offensively by quarterback Matthew Thayer and wide receiver Jovonte Suber. The Pioneers are led defensively by linebacker Dominic Goseyun and lineman Piero Cooper who have been bright spots this season on an otherwise struggling defensive unit.





Raiders Defeat Rough Riders with Defensive Masterclass

The Racine defense dominated from the start of the game forcing six turnovers as they took down the River City Rough Riders (7-4), 30-0, at home on Saturday. The Raiders extended their win streak to 22 games, putting them in sole possession of the fourth-longest winning streak in Raiders team history.

The Raiders offense continued their efficiency by totaling just over 300 yards total yards while scoring two passing and two rushing touchdowns in their win over the Rough Riders. The defense continued to dominate allowing only 120 total yards while shutting out their opponent for the third time this season. The defense accumulated three sacks, four interceptions, and four fumble recoveries.

At the start of the game, the Rough Riders received the opening kick and almost just as soon as they got it, the Raiders took it away with a Justin Benko interception to give the Raiders the ball at River City's three-yard line. This led to a Rashawn Herron three-yard touchdown run. Brady Wodack came on for the extra point to make it 7-0 with just under 14 minutes remaining in the first quarter.

The Raiders defense stepped up again, this time when Ronald Haggins forced a fumble and Gary Young Jr. picked it up, to give Racine possession at the Rough Riders 33-yard line. This led to a 38-yard field goal by Wodack to make it 10-0 with just under nine minutes remaining in the first quarter.

Racine's next score came just after halftime when Herron found the endzone for a second time on a four-yard rush. Wodack came on for the extra point and made it 17-0 with just under eight minutes remaining in the third quarter. Racine would score again when Andre Locke, Sr. connected with Jashon Foster for a 17-yard touchdown. Wodack came on and made it 24-0 with just over eight minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Raiders final score of the game came after an interception by Channing Schultz gave the Raiders possession at their 35-yard line. Backup quarterback Sawyer Schick drove the offense downfield and found Jacquez Woodland on a 16-yard touchdown pass.

Player Profile:

Jersey Eickhorst Lived a Dream in 2023



Defensive back and wide receiver Jersey Eickhorst is midway through his fourth season with the Racine Raiders, and returns this season after taking last year to continue his education and fulfill a lifelong dream of playing professionally.

Before joining the Raiders in 2019, Eickhorst played for Benedictine University where his football career ended due to suffering an injury that forced him to be sidelined for the rest of his senior year.

"The initial reason I joined the Raiders was because my senior year was cut short due to a Lisfranc foot injury and I was seeking closure to be able to step away from the game under my own will...not because of an unfortunate injury," Eickhorst said. While searching for a way to continue his football career, it led to an opportunity he was already familiar with.

"Being from Racine I grew up watching the Raiders," Eickhorst said. This prompted him to return to where he grew up and finish his career on his own terms.

After spending three seasons with the Raiders, Eickhorst was given an opportunity in 2023 that he believed he couldn't pass up. Eickhorst was contacted by a recruiter from the University of Bristol England and was allowed to pursue a master's degree in England for a year while playing football for the university.

"I felt it was an easy decision for me with football being the motivating factor but also the ability to see a different part of the world and be fully immersed in a new culture with the ability to travel places I never thought I'd see," Eickhorst stated. "Also understanding the opportunity like that to get my master's doesn't come along often."

After spending the year completing his master's and playing for the university's football team - which won the English collegiate national championship - Eickhorst was looking for the next step in his journey. This led to him completing a lifelong dream of signing a professional contract where he signed with the Graz Giants who are a part of the Austrian Football League.

"Being able to sign that contract was a dream come true. All the time training and working towards that goal was finally reached," Eickhorst said. "(It) was my dream as a child and I'm beyond blessed being able to reflect and say that I've achieved that."

"My main motivation for returning is trying to be a part of bringing another championship back to my hometown," Eickhorst stated. "I wasn't a part of it last year and I want to do whatever I can do to be a part of bringing something like that back to Racine for all the loyal fans and the community that's behind us."

2024 Racine Raiders Hall of Fame Inductees

Mike "Ice" Baldwin joined the Raiders in 1995 after concluding his career at Illinois State University and stayed through the 2003 season. Ice helped lead Racine to a national title in 1995 while earning defensive rookie of the year honors. Ice played in four national championship games in his time with the Raiders. Ice is currently the defensive backs coach for the Raiders.

Fulton Bell, Jr. joined the Racine Gladiators in 1984 and continued with Raiders until 1990. Fulton was (and is again) a valued member of the Raiders coaching staff, filling the role of

the Raiders coaching staff, filling the role of wide receivers coach from 1994-1996 and again from 2017 to today. He was also a member of the board of directors in 2016 and

2017.

Brian Forston played in 256 consecutive games at linebacker for Racine from 1989 to 2005. Forston was part of four world or national championship teams in 1989, 1992, 1995, and 2001 while helping lead the Raiders to eight total title games. In the 1995 world championship game, he returned an interception for a touchdown and was named the game's most valuable player. Brian is a two-time national defensive player of the year and was inducted into the American Football Association Hall of Fame in 2004 and the Minor League Football News Hall of Fame in 2007.

Tom Kohr joined the Racine Raiders in 1973. He played for Racine as both a Raider from 1973-1975 and again from 1978-1981 as a Gladiator. He was a player on the 1981 Racine Gladiators team that won a national title. Following his playing days, he coached for the team from 1981 through 2004. He was the offensive coordinator for four national championships in 1983, 1989, 1992, and 1995. Tom has been inducted into three other halls of fame including the American Football Association Hall of Fame in 1997.

Tammie Radspinner was a cheerleader for the Racine Gladiators starting in their inaugural season in 1978. She was part of semi-pro football for over eight years and coached high school poms for over two decades.

Brandon Rogers graduated from Zion Benton Township High School in 2000 and went on to graduate from Tennessee State University in Nashville in 2006. He immediately joined the Raiders and played with Racine for a decade, being named a defensive captain three times and helping lead the team to national titles in 2012 and 2014.




