

Gridiron Bowl XV Showdown Between Upstate Predators & Racine Raiders



As the summer sun begins to set and the echoes of whistles and cheers fill the air, one final game remains to crown a champion in the 15th edition of the Gridiron Bowl. This year's matchup is a clash of titans, featuring the Upstate Predators and the Racine Raiders—a team with a storied legacy and ten national championships to their name since 1981. Fans are brimming with anticipation as these two powerhouses prepare to lock horns on the gridiron, and this year's Gridiron Bowl promises to be nothing short of epic.

A Legacy of Dominance

The Racine Raiders have long been the standard-bearers of excellence in semi-professional football. With ten national championships under their belt, beginning with the 1981 crown that marked the beginning of their dynasty, and most recently capturing the 2024 Gridiron Bowl XIV crown by defeating the West Sound (WA) Rebels 27-18 last year. The Raiders have built a tradition of winning that few teams can match, and Gridiron Bowl XV offers Racine a chance to etch another chapter into their already illustrious history. The Raiders currently have more wins in their history (678 all-time) than any other team at this level of play.

But standing in their way are the Upstate Predators, a team hungry for their slice of glory. The Predators have clawed their way through the ranks with a ferocity that has made them one of the most feared teams in the Gridiron Developmental Football League. This year, they have their sights set on toppling the mighty Raiders and claiming their first Gridiron Bowl title.

Key Players to Watch

The outcome of Gridiron Bowl XV may very well hinge on the performances of three standout players: Billy Joiner from the Upstate Predators, and Andre Locke and Gary Young, Jr. from the Racine Raiders. These athletes have been the heartbeat of their respective teams all season, and their playmaking abilities will be critical on game day.

Billy Joiner - The Predator's Alpha

Billy Joiner, the dynamic quarterback of the Upstate Predators, is the epitome of a dual-threat signal-caller. With a cannon for an arm and the legs to match, Joiner has been terrorizing defenses all season long. His ability to extend plays and make something out of nothing has been the hallmark of the Predators' offense. Joiner's leadership on the field is just as important as his physical abilities; he's the kind of player who can rally his team when the stakes are highest.

This season, Joiner has amassed impressive stats, both in the air (1,311 yards passing; 187.3 yards/game, 18 TDs) and on the ground (132 yards; 1 TD). His deep ball accuracy has kept opposing secondaries on their heels, while his quickness and vision as a runner have made him a nightmare to defend in the open field. If the Predators are to overcome the seasoned Raiders, it will be on the shoulders of their fearless leader and 2024 MVP candidate, Billy Joiner.

Gary Young, Jr - Racine's Field General

On the defensive side, the Raiders boast one of the most formidable players in the league: linebacker Gary Young, Jr. Known for his hard-hitting run stoppage and ball-hawking skills, Young is the centerpiece of a Raiders defense that has been impenetrable throughout the season. His ability to put pressure on the QB in the pocket and patrol the middle of the field has forced many quarterbacks to panic, often with disastrous results.

Young's athleticism and football IQ make him a game-changer, capable of flipping momentum with a single play. His potential to disrupt Billy Joiner's rhythm could very well decide the game's outcome. A crucial interception, sack, or a key pass breakup could be all it takes for Racine to tip the scales in their favor.

Andre Locke - The Raiders' Offensive Catalyst

While the Raiders' defense is a force to be reckoned with, their offense is no slouch, largely thanks to the reigning GDFL MVP, quarterback Andre Locke. Locke has once again amassed impressive stats in the regular season in the air (1,267 yards; 21 TDs) and on the ground. His knack for extending plays with his legs is rivaled only by Billy Joiner, and his record in championship games during his decade (plus) career is unequaled.

As the Raiders prepare for their showdown with the Predators, Locke's role as a playmaker will be more important than ever. Expect him to be at the center of Racine's offensive game plan, as they look to exploit any weaknesses in the Predators' defense. (con't page 4)





RAIDER PLAYER PROFILE

Andre Locke Sr: Dominating On the Field and Inspiring Off It

Joining The Raiders

Quarterback Andre Locke, Sr. is finishing his second season with the Racine Raiders. Locke is following up on a tremendous 2023 season where he totaled over 2,400 yards and 34 touchdowns, with 1,600 yards and 26 touchdowns in several fewer games during 2024.

Before joining the Raiders in 2023, Locke played for the Chicago Birdgang in the MSFL and twice played the Raiders in 2022. During one of the teams' matchups Raiders head coach Wilbert Kennedy spoke with Locke about his play and the interest both sides had in Locke potentially joining the Raiders.

One of the biggest aspects of Locke joining the Raiders in 2023 is Kennedy's message to his players of becoming a structured player who can adapt and overcome various aspects of the game. This message, which is something that Locke had already followed before his time with the Raiders, is, in large part, a reason why he joined.

"I'm a structured player and what coach Wilbert Kennedy preaches is the same message that I give as a leader," said Locke.

Another reason Locke joined the Raiders is that he grew up in the Chicagoland area. Growing up in the area around the Raiders, Locke heard and saw many distinct aspects of Raiders football. One of the biggest aspects for him is the Raiders fan base.

"I've played college and arena football, so I promised myself before I was done, I'd play and finish as a Raider under the best fan base this level has to offer," Locke stated.

In Locke's first year with the Raiders, they brought home their tenth national championship and Locke received MVP honors in both the championship game and from the GDFL for the 2023 season. This weekend the Raiders go for national championship number eleven against the Upstate Predators from Rochester, NY. In terms of these two Raiders teams and the success they have enjoyed, Locke gives credit to his coaches and teammates.

"It's an honor to lead our team this far and getting our organization back in the national spotlight where we belong," Locke said. "In 2023, it (a championship) was my main goal for the season and the MVP was the icing on the cake, but a combination of Coach Schick's brain and my whole offense at work. I just got the credit."

Locke's team goals remain the same this season and are near fulfillment. "The ultimate goal is always the main focus, which is to bring home (championship) number 11," he states.

Steller On-Field Performance

This season, Locke has delivered multiple standout performances, cemented him as one of the league's elite players. Putting up 1593 passing yards, 26 passing touchdowns, 94 rushing yards, one rushing touchdown, and a QB rating of 108.0 while starting in nine games during the season. Locke has been the key contributor for the Raiders all season averaging 35.6 points per game which has resulted in the Raiders having the best offense in the Gridiron Development Football League (GDFL).

While playing out of his mind throughout the season Locke's best performance came in week five of the season when the Raiders traveled to St. Paul to take on the Pioneers. In a game where the Raiders never trailed Locke totaled 213 yards and five passing touchdowns while having a QB rating of 130.9 which made him almost perfect on the night. This game not only showed Locke's composure throughout, but also his ability to spread the ball around resulting in four different receivers scoring a touchdown. This makes it harder for the defense to get a read on who may be getting the ball pre-snap, so Locke is able to gain the upper hand on the defense before the ball is ever even snapped.

Making an Impact Off the Field

Off the field, Locke is the offensive coordinator at CICS Longwood and coaches baseball at Phillips High School, both in Chicago. Locke is proud to help youth carve a positive path in life for themselves.

"We have 11-out-of-11 seniors graduating and nine of which are extending their playing career at the next level," brags Locke. "That's honestly why I coach and it's a blessing to be a part of the next generation's future."

Locke is proud to be part of the future of the game and, in typical Locke fashion, even gives credit to teammate Anton Graham. Graham is the head football coach at Racine Case High School and Locke admires the amazing job he's done there.

Looking Ahead

With Locke's impressive season stats and his consistent dedication to making a difference on and off the field he is set to continue inspiring both his teammates on-the-field and in his community off-the-field. Locke's journey serves as a powerful reminder of the positive impact that athletes can have, proving that greatness extends beyond the field.




