Back-to-Back Champs Begin Title Defense Saturday Night Against Tennessee Hornets

RACINE – A new season dawns in Racine, but the mission remains the same: defend the crown. The Racine Raiders, back-to-back national champions and owners of a staggering 27-game winning streak, will kick off their 2025 campaign this Saturday, May 3rd, at 7:00 p.m. with a home opener against the Tennessee Hornets at Historic Horlick Athletic Field.

Fans in Racine have come to expect excellence from the Raiders, and this year's team appears well-equipped to meet those lofty standards once again. Leading the way is two-time team MVP Gary Young, Jr., a force in the middle of the Raiders' defense. Known for his instincts, physicality, and leadership, Young (72 total tackles, 4 sacks, 3 interceptions, 1 TD) anchors a defensive unit that has consistently shut down some of the top offenses in the nation.

On the offensive side, the Raiders welcome back their 2024 Offensive MVP Rashawn Herron (473 yards rushing, 7 TDs), a bruising and elusive running back who powered Racine's ground game last season. Herron's combination of speed and power makes him a nightmare for defenders and a spark for an offense that prides itself on controlling the tempo and wearing down opponents.

Awaiting them on the other side of the line is the Tennessee Hornets – a summer, traveling all-star team composed of elite talent from Tennessee, Alabama, and Georgia. The Hornets, many of whom compete in the EAFL winter league, are expected to bring speed, athleticism, and a fearless mentality into Horlick Field. In a Friday morning radio interview, Raiders' Head Coach Wilbert Kennedy stated he expected a much different team from the 2024 Hornets team that was blown out in Racine. That team lost a significant portion of its roster on the trip north due to van mechanical failure. The Hornets have taken precautions not to have a repeat scenario, which stranded most of their offensive and defensive linemen.

But Saturday night's game is about more than just football. The Raiders through the **sponsorship of D.W. Davies & Co.**, Inc. are hosting Education Appreciation Night, offering free admission to all educators with a valid school ID. At halftime, the team will honor four local students as recipients of 2025 Racine Raiders Scholarships, a cherished tradition that reflects the organization's commitment to supporting the next generation.

Adding to the night's buzz is the return of a familiar face: former Raider linebacker and coach Pete Deates rejoins the coaching staff as Defensive Coordinator. Deates, a respected voice in the locker room and a key architect of past Raiders defenses, is expected to bring added intensity and tactical sharpness to an already formidable unit.







RAIDERS AWARD SCHOLARSHIPS



Through the years, part of the mission of the Racine Raiders was to give back to the communities that have given the Raiders so much support. One of the most notable ways is the awarding of scholarships to 4 graduating seniors of Racine County's 10 high schools. Included in the selection criteria is a grade point average of 3.0 or better, participating in an athletic function as a team member, cheer team, manager, or coach of a youth team in a community-recognized league.

Selecting the final 4 candidates is no easy task for the Raiders Scholarship Committee. And this year was no different in making the selections from the 23 applications submitted. After hours of reviewing applications, 4 were selected to receive a one-time \$500 scholarship for 2025. Each scholarship is a memorial to 4 individuals who have made an impact on the Racine Raiders Football Club.

The Herb Hoppe Scholarship

A soon-to-be Case High School graduate, Adam Contreras was a 2 sport athlete for the Eagles in both football and baseball. In baseball, he was a pitcher all 4 years at Case, but it was football that was his calling. He was a defensive back on the JV team in his freshman and sophomore years, moving to the same position on the varsity squad in his junior and senior years. His play this past season earned him a spot as a defensive back on the All-County second team defense. Outside of sports, he is active in the community, volunteering for events such as Party on the Pavement, Greek Fest, and Roma Lodge Pancake Day. Through all this and while maintaining a grade point average of 3.5, Adam has overcome a severe hearing deficit requiring the use of hearing aids. He has been active in the Racine Unified School District's Deaf and Hard of Hearing program and has been an example and inspiration for academic and athletic achievements for the younger deaf and hard of hearing students. Adam's interest in college will keep him close to athletics as he is looking into Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, or Athletic Training as a career. He will be attending Carthage College this fall.

The Gary Suhr Scholarship

He will have memories that will last a lifetime as a member of Park High School's basketball team this season. Not only was it going to State, but for Cameron Betker, that Cinderella season saw him earn a position as a starter for the Panthers in his senior year. All that somewhat overshadowed this 3-sport athlete in his other venues as he was a starter on Park's volleyball team all of his 4 years there, making captain his last 2. He also played Varsity baseball in his junior and senior years. Outside of sports, Cameron has been involved with food drives for HALO, helping those with disabilities partake in bowling and baseball through the Koos for Kids organization. Earning a 4.0 GPA along with taking AP courses at Parkside and Gateway, Cameron looks to center his college education on business and accounting.

The Jean Mooney Scholarship

She has her sights set on a nursing career. A career that will take her into one of the most intensive practices in nursing. Anabella Valdivia wants to become a neonatal nurse, working to care for babies that are premature or have medical or physical conditions. So how does a 4 year varsity soccer player for Horlick relate to that? Anabella maintains a philosophy that in her own words "make sure to set myself and my team to very high standards during practices and games in order to produce the highest quality of play possible." It is that kind of leadership that earned her a position as co-captain in her junior year of the 4 years on the team. Outside of athletics, Anabella has volunteered at Horlick setting up school dances and helping with the annual holiday fair. She has also worked at the concessions for basketball games. She has also been involved with Toys for Tots and Rock the Block for the Youth Volunteer Corps in Racine County. This fall, with her 4.0 GPA from Horlick, she will be attending U.W. Milwaukee to start her road to becoming a neonatal nurse.

The Len Ziolkowski Scholarship

Call it luck or skill, but this Bronco tried out for the Union Grove golf team after not playing for over 10 years, Marley Busey dusted off the clubs, tried out, earned a varsity spot on the team. He also tried one season in volleyball as he put it, working hard to learn a new sport. But his sports for his 4 years at Union Grove were basketball and soccer. His freshman and sophomore year had him playing JV basketball, moving up to varsity in his junior and senior years where they won conference championships 2 years in a row and up to sectional. All for years he was on the varsity roster for soccer. According to Marley, the team developed a strong bond which helped them take 3 conference championships and 2 trips to sectionals. His outside volunteer activities include Tee It Up For Ty, a golf event to raise money for needy families in Union Grove. He has also worked at other fundraising events and other local programs as part of his membership in the National Honor Society. His 3.9 GPA will help him get into school so he can earn his Bachelor of Science in Nursing, eventually becoming a Certified Nurse Anesthetist.




