# Raiders and Cowboys Renew Rivalry with National Reputations on the Line

**RACINE** – Longtime MSFL league rivals the Illinois Cowboys and Racine Raiders match up this weekend for the first time since 2023. The two were foes for a decade in the Mid-States Football League, and played some epic contests. The last matchup in 2023 belied the competitiveness of the series, as the Cowboys were missing several key players in the non-league matchup. That matchup was the first after the MSFL became defunct after the 2022 season. The Raiders were in their first season in the GDLF, while the Cowboys were new members of the NLFL. Both teams would eventually win their respective championships, but on that June 2023 night, the Raiders rolled to a 40-0 victory over the Cowboys.

You can bet that the Cowboys are determined to prove that game a fluke, and have not lost a game since that night. They won the remainder of their games in 2023, went undefeated for the 2024 season, including a national championship bowl game win in February 2025, and have not lost a game so far this season.

The Cowboys opened the season against the Indy Bison in a neutral-site contest at the University of Cincinnati. Illinois held on for a narrow 22-21 victory over the Bison, surviving a ferocious comeback attempt by Indy. Game two saw the Cowboys take care of a very solid Michigan Bills program at home. The 20-14 victory was once again sealed late in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter by the Cowboys' defense. Last weekend, the Chicago Falcons fell to the Cowboys 31-6 in a convincing victory by Illinois.

Your Racine Raiders are also 3-0 on the season with a 35-0 home opening win on May 3<sup>rd</sup> against the Tennessee Hornets, and back-to-back road wins: 31-14 over the Michigan Bills and 16-0 against the Flag City Phantoms. The stage is set for these two nationally ranked powerhouses to settle the debate on top dog in the upper midwest...at least until the next time they meet!

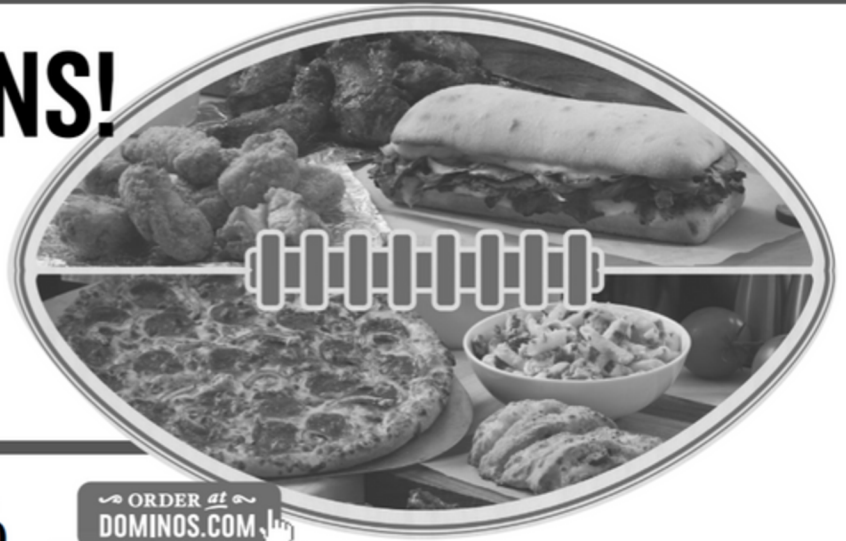

## **RACINE RAIDERS HALFTIME INTERVIEW**

*\*the transcription below is from the halftime interview being included in tonight's game broadcast.*

### **Don Wadewitz, Director of Livestreaming, Racine Raiders:**

Today we're celebrating the 1995 Racine Raiders USFA National Championship team's 30th anniversary. And joining me to talk about that a little bit is Racine Raiders board member, General Manager, and Offensive Coordinator, Geoffrey Schick. Geoff, that 1995 team, you had an opportunity to be a part of that. What was it like to be able to claim that title?

### **Geoffrey Schick, General Manager, Offensive Coordinator, and former player ('95 - '98):**

That was my rookie year playing for the Raiders, so I had nothing to compare it against in terms of my Raider career at that time. It was a great experience in terms of being able to join the Raiders that year, which was also the first season in the Mid-Continent Football League. So, a new experience for everyone, and we experienced the community getting behind us as we progressed through the season...ultimately culminating in Marlboro, MA, in the USFA national championship victory. It still is one of the best experiences of my life, from a football perspective; it was fantastic in terms of the ability to bond and make lifelong friends and drove home some incredible memories that cemented my passion for this organization for 30 years now.

### **Don Wadewitz:**

Several of those folks are still involved with the team to this day, either on the coaching staff, on the board, or in multiple capacities, like yourself. So that is really something that's kind of held throughout time, is that commitment to the organization with folks from the team?

### **Geoffrey Schick:**

Yeah, head coach Will Kennedy had a long, illustrious playing career with the Raiders, and now a head coach. Our board president, Matt Nelson was on that team, and had played for several years before that, and continues his passion to keep the organization at the upper echelon of comparative organizations around the country. Mike "Ice" Baldwin was a rookie with me that year in '95 and is currently on the coaching staff. Other players who are still involved include some of our advisory board members, Greg Fictum, and Gregg Erchull, who continue to be engaged with the Raiders three decades later. Beyond these few I named, there are many other individuals still active due to the bond we created with each other and within this community. We all continue to support and find ways to ensure the Racine Raiders organization thrives.

### **Don Wadewitz:**

Since that team, you've had a chance to be a part of a few national championship teams here as a coach and board member. What are some things that have changed in the landscape at this level, over the 30 years that you've kind of noticed? Maybe a couple of the biggest things?

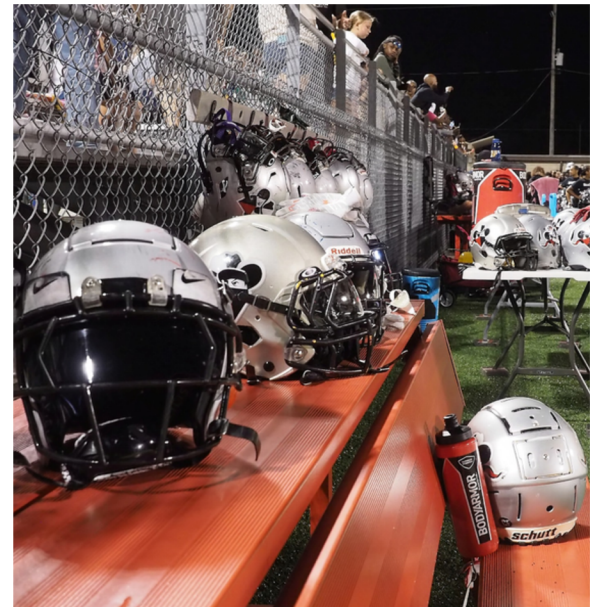

**Geoffrey Schick:**

I think the blend between football and real life, so to speak, has changed in terms of balance. Thirty years ago, we practiced twice a week, and early in the season, we practiced three times a week: Tuesday, Thursday, and then a little bit on Saturday mornings to get ready for the season. Now we have cut one of those out. So early season, it's twice a week, and in-season, it's only once. It makes a difference in terms of the ability of coaching staff to develop players and get ready. So that's a little bit different. The game of football has changed quite a bit. We try and be modern; to incorporate new concepts in terms of how we're designing our offensive and defensive schemes. I hope the fans see some consistency between the experience for being at the game is:

- 1) to see high-quality football that we put on the field,  
and
- 2) to be in an environment that is supported not only by the Raiders, but by the city of Racine, in terms of facility upgrades, what we're able to do for fans, such as the live stream broadcast for those that can't be there in person.

But the core experience is a Saturday evening, watching some quality football, and some great food from the concession stands with your neighbors and friends from around the area who also choose to come to the game. I think we continue to have a lot of fans that are regulars and that find that incorporating Racine Raider football on Saturday nights in the summer is, you know, the way they like to spend a lot of their weekends

**Don Wadewitz:**

With the travel that the Raiders had to do the last couple of years while being in the Gridiron Developmental Football League - and now while in the Players Football Association - has that brought back any memories? I'm talking about in 1995 having to go out to Marlboro and those sorts of things, compared with (especially) two years ago, having to go to New York and then DC over back-to-back weeks to claim that national championship. Did that bring back any memories for you, or perhaps any nightmares of those long trips?

**Geoffrey Schick:**

Great question. I think back over the last four years that I've been an assistant coach and coordinator with the Raiders, and in comparison, we traveled more back in the mid to late 90s. We had the MCFL in the Upper Midwest, including teams from Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan, Illinois, and Wisconsin. We would have home and homes with these teams. So as an example, Kokomo, IN would come to us. Later in the season we would go to Kokomo. Same with Columbus, Ohio, same with some of the Michigan teams. So we had more travel, more balanced schedules. This year we're traveling four times, and then again perhaps in the playoffs. When you get into the postseason, you never know exactly where you're going to go, and how it's going to wind up.

But the memories, some of the best memories we have, when we get together as “old guys”... fellow veterans from the Raiders that played together. The stories come from our road trips; from Saturday nights after the game in Louisville. Stories from the drive to and from Detroit in order to make it back to Racine before “last call” at a local establishment. Things like that are what we remember, and what we talk about. Those road trips cemented relationships.

I thought this would never be true when people told me this, but I honestly don't remember the final scores or specific plays within games as much anymore. The best memories are based on stuff that happened, either before or after the game with teammates, either in celebrations or in travel experiences, things like that. Those are the stories that resonate, and we talk about more than actual games.

**Don Wadewitz:**

All right, Geoff, well, thanks for taking a few minutes with us to be able to kind of draw a line between 1995 as we honor that national championship team, and 2025 here during halftime of the Illinois Is Cowboys game.
