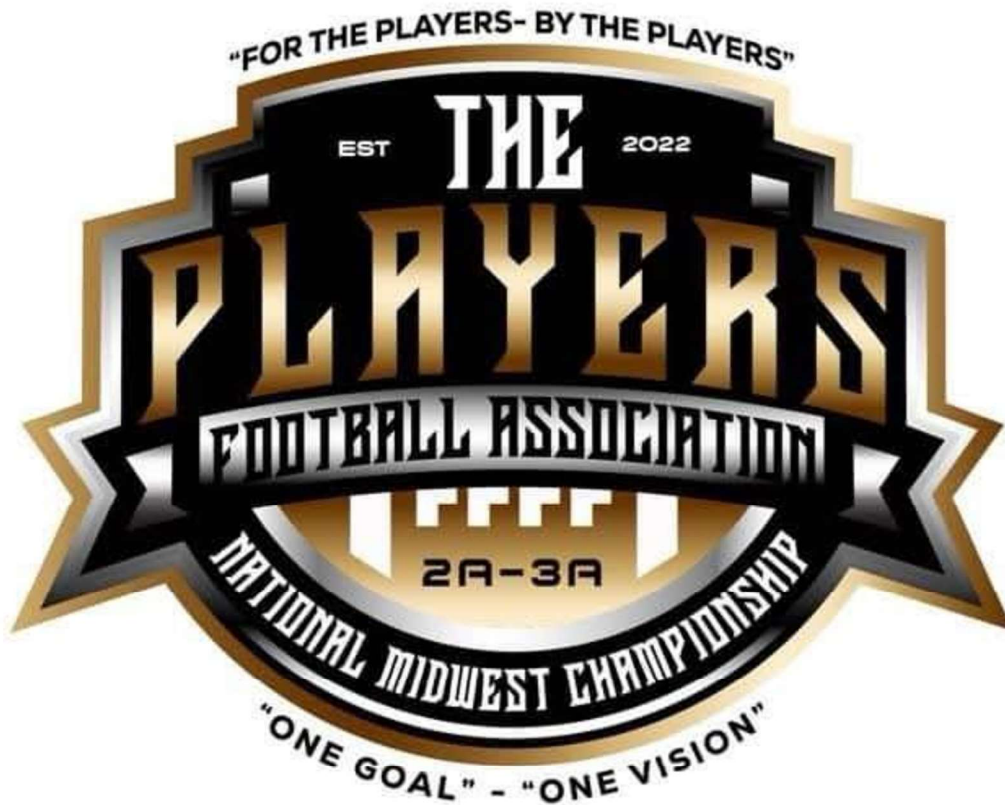

Total Domination: Raiders Crush Roughriders 37-7

RACINE – The Racine Raiders (6-2) are back in the win column with a dominant 37-7 victory over the River City Roughriders. After an offensive mishap early in the first quarter that led to a Roughriders score, the Raiders never looked back scoring 37 straight points. The Raiders' offense showed signs of improvement this week, greatly improving the passing game which has desperately needed this season. The Raiders defense returned to dominance last night, shutting out the Roughriders offense.

The Raiders once again started the game with an offensive turnover, but after that, they never looked back as they pulled farther and farther ahead. The Raiders offense put up just over 160 yards of offense while scoring one rush and two passing touchdowns.

The Raiders' defense continued their dominance, shutting out the Roughriders across the board. The Raiders' defense allowed only seven total yards while adding seven sacks and four fumble recoveries where two were recovered for touchdowns.

The first score of the night came early in the first quarter. The Raiders had possession in their territory when a bad snap went over the head of quarterback Andre Locke Jr. The fumbled snap was recovered by Todd Bland and returned for a 30-yard touchdown. Kicker Jared Konsella came on for the extra point and hit it, making it 7-0 with just over 10 minutes remaining in the first quarter.

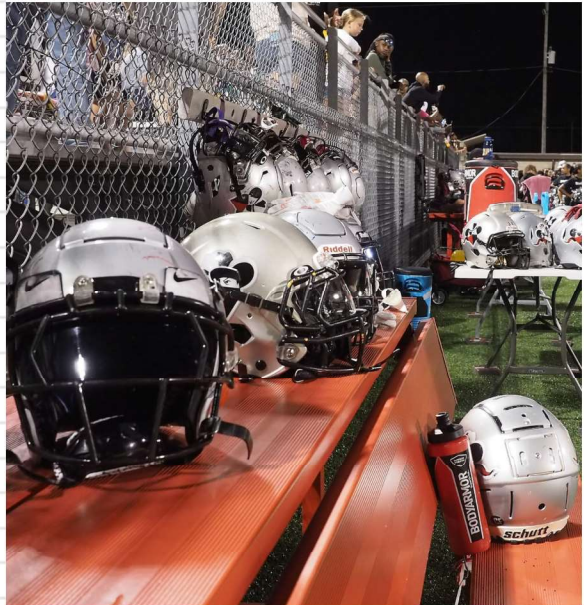
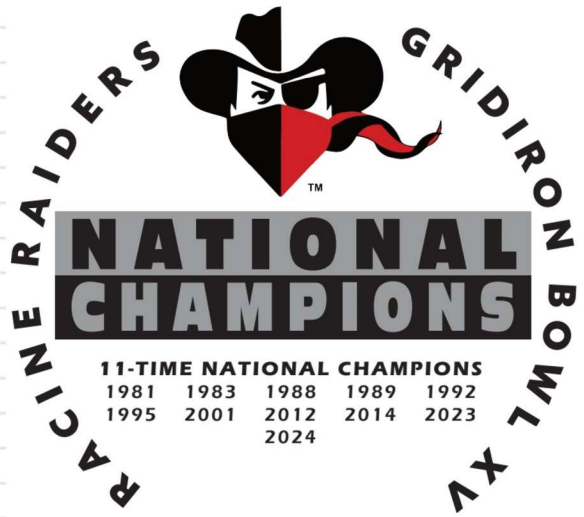

Cameron Hall: A Football Journey Forged Through Pressure

From the time Hall first picked up a football at the age of 10, he has lived and breathed the game of football. Throughout Hall's journey in the sport of football, he's shown resilience every step of the way. From the beginning, Hall has been determined to climb the ranks of semi and professional football. From his start in youth leagues to the bright lights of professional arena football, and now to a championship caliber semi-pro team on the verge of a historic three-peat, the Racine Raiders.

"I bounced around a lot," Hall says. "High school, college at Elmhurst, where I graduated in 2017. Started semi-pro with the Midway Marauders, then went pro with the Chicago Chaos in 2017 and 2018. From there, it was a ride."

That ride included stints with the Bloomington Edge, Omaha Beef, Bismarck Bucks, Louisville Xtreme, and even the Fan Controlled Football League, where he won the title in 2022. More recently, he's played for the Illinois Cowboys and the Leighton Lions in 2023 and 2024 before returning to Arena football this season with the Billings Outlaws and the Oregon Lightning.

Joining the Raiders

Returning to his roots in the Midwest, Hall joined the Racine Raiders before the 2025 season, having drawn interest from familiar faces on the Raiders and a culture unlike any other in semi-pro football. *(Continues next page.)*



“I’ve known a lot of the guys, Bibby Davis, Gary Young, Andre Locke, and Ron Higgins, I’ve known for years. They were the biggest push in seeing what I have going on, being back in the Midwest. After meeting with Coach Kennedy and Coach Deates and just seeing how things are set up, it’s not your normal semi-pro outlook. It’s memorable and favorable for people to show up for practices, and having the professionalism and culture with the Raiders is the closest you can get to professional ball from top to bottom, from coaches to captains to players,” said Hall.

Joining a team that’s aiming for a third straight championship brings added pressure, something Hall never shies away from. “That pressure either breaks you or creates diamonds, and I enjoy the pressure,” Hall says. “Knowing it’s a standard with the team I wanted to join and be a part of trying to get that three-peat. Hearing of the top teams and finally being able to play against them, it’s added that layer of competition similar to the professional level that I enjoy being a part of.”

Hall’s competitive edge has only been sharpened by the relationships he’s building with those who are a part of the Raiders team.

“Coach Pete Deates has been a constant voice, having conversations on game days and during the week. I’ve played with Bibby Davis before, and he understands the mentality and grind. I’ve had conversations with Gary Young for years about football, but finally being in the same huddle and being able to learn from another top player and how they process the game is another added layer. Elvin Turner, or Buka as we call him, our relationship took time, but we have developed a deeper connection, and a big part of it is Turner not being afraid to say stop complaining and let’s figure it out,” says Hall.

In terms of individual stats or accolades, Hall isn't chasing personal success; he's chasing one thing only, and that's wins. "I just want to help the team win and do whatever I can to help the team get the three-peat. I've got a couple of rings myself, but I want to add another one for this three-peat. If any personal success comes from winning, that's always a plus, but I never came in looking for any personal success," said Hall.

Off the Field

When Hall is not spending time on the field, he's a laid-back guy who enjoys time with friends and family. He enjoys nights out bowling with teammates and friends, staying active in the gym, and heading to the local gun range for some time. After years of a football first mentality, Hall is now beginning to look at long-term opportunities with the possibilities of trucking, firefighting, and even welding, after an experience working in oil. Currently, Hall is working with a snow, ice, and landscaping company outside of Chicago, picking up hours and staying grounded.

There's a lot to be proud of in Cameron Hall's story, but what has the most impact is the odds that Hall has beaten along the way. Whether it was winning the 2022 Fan Controlled Football Championship as heavy underdogs, breaking a 43-year title drought at St. Teresa High School, proving doctors wrong after four surgeries, or graduating from high school and college for his grandmother. Hall's journey shows one thing: he's not just here to play, he's here to leave a legacy.

The next score of the game came from the Raiders. The Roughriders possessed the ball inside their 10-yard line and looked to go deep when the Raiders defensive line put the pressure on and forced the strip sack. Ronald Haggins was able to fall on the fumble in the endzone for a fumble recovery touchdown. Mike Peralta came on for the extra point and nailed it, making it 7-7 with just under six minutes remaining in the first quarter.

The Raiders would score once again right before the end of the first quarter. After a huge 54-yard punt return by Jacquez Woodland, the Raiders possessed the ball at the Roughriders 34-yard line. Two plays later Locke was able to find Bubba Rewolinski open in the corner of the endzone. Rewolinski was able to reach up while falling backward for the stellar one-handed 19-yard touchdown catch. Peralta would nail the extra point making it 14-7 with just under 30 seconds left in the first quarter. The Raiders' next score of the game would come from the Raiders defense once again. This time the Roughriders possessed the ball inside their 25-yard line and were in a fourth and long where they were forced to punt. On the punt attempt the ball would sail over the punter's head and be recovered by Aarion Ivy for a fumble recovery touchdown. Peralta hit the extra point, making it 21-7 with just over seven minutes remaining in the second quarter.

Early in the second half, the Raiders defense would once again add points on the board this time coming from a safety. The Roughriders possessed the ball at their seven-yard line and were once again in a fourth in long scenario. On the punt attempt the ball went over the head of the punter and out of the back of the endzone resulting in a safety. This made it 23-7 with just over 13 minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The next score of the game came from the Raiders' offense when they forced their way into the endzone. The Raiders possessed the ball at the Roughriders two-yard line when Tavin Allen forced his way into the endzone making it 30-7 with just under seven minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Raiders would add another score on the board right before the end of the quarter for the final score of the game. After another bad snap fumble by the Roughriders, the Raiders had possession at the Roughriders five-yard line. Quarterback Sawyer Schick was able to find an open Ian Gaines in the endzone for a five-yard touchdown. Peralta would nail the extra point once again making it 37-7 with just over one minute remaining in the third quarter.

The Raiders' passing game greatly improved this week with their best performance of the season so far. Andre Locke Jr completed 10-of-17 attempts for 152 yards with one touchdown. Sawyer Schick completed 2-of-3 attempts for nine yards and one touchdown.

The Raiders running game struggled to get things going this week. Leading the way was Howard Triplett with five carries for 13 yards. Behind him was Andre Locke with four carries for seven yards. Tavin Allen added two carries for zero yards and one touchdown while Tom Benko added two carries for eight yards.

Raider's receivers had their best week this past week. Leading the way was Bubba Rewolinski with two catches for 34 yards and one touchdown. Behind him was Ian Gaines who added four catches for 30 yards and one touchdown. Others with receptions were Jashon Foster with one reception for 45 yards, Tom Benko had two receptions for 24 yards, Rashawn Herron with one reception for 18 yards, and Rico Flores with one reception for 10 yards.

The Raiders defense returned to form absolutely dominating the Roughriders offense allowing only seven total yards while adding seven sacks, four fumble recoveries, and two touchdowns. Leading the way for the Raiders defensive line was Ronald Haggins who tallied two sacks, one fumble recovery, and one touchdown. Leading the way for the linebackers was a familiar name in Aarion Ivy who once again shredded the offense. Ivy totaled four tackles, one sack, one forced fumble/recovery, and a touchdown. Leading the way for the secondary was Corey Dalton who added two tackles and multiple pass breakups on the night.

The Raiders will look to continue their dominance this week when they face the Alabama Beavers on Saturday, June 28th, at Historic Horlick Athletic Field. The game will have a 7:00 pm CT kickoff where gates open at 5:30 pm.
