Raiders Roll Over Midwest Vengeance 59-0

RACINE, WI – The Racine Raiders are on an early-season roll that is likely among the best in the 73-year history of the organization. The Raiders were solid in all phases of their nonleague game Saturday against the Midwest Vengeance, winning 59-0 to shut out their second straight opponent. Starting quarterback Sawyer Schick had three touchdown passes in the first half, Bubba Rewolinski returned the second-half kickoff for a touchdown, and Thomas Burton had a fumble return for a touchdown to finish off the scoring. Add in their 54-0 victory over the Burlington Blue Devils last weekend, and the Raiders have outscored their first two opponents 113-0.

About the only thing that went wrong for the Raiders Saturday was multiple penalties, including three unsportsmanlike conduct penalties and one ejection, and one in-game chewing out by head coach Wilbert Kennedy about one rule all players should know.

The Vengeance, who play in the Midwest Developmental Football League, were coming off a season-opening 34-0 victory over the Indiana Assassins, but brought just two dozen players to Racine and were overmatched from the start.

The Raiders forced a three-and-out on the Vengeance's first series and almost had lightning strike with a big punt return by Trevion Carothers, who returned two punts for touchdowns last week against the Blue Devils. The return was negated by a penalty, but it took just two plays for the Raiders to get on the scoreboard when Schick hit Joe Garcia III in stride on a 34-yard strike.



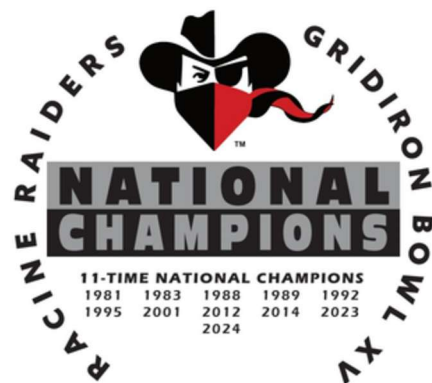

Later in the first quarter, Schick connected with Rewolinski on a 41-yard touchdown pass and it was 14-0.

The defense continued to stymie the Vengeance, sacking quarterback Adrieon Smith four times, three times by linebacker Cameron Hall, and negating their running game.

Schick's third touchdown pass took a little more work than the first two. He had to escape the pocket and rolled left to find McKinstry, who fell down right after catching the ball, but got up right away before being touched and ran through one defender and reached the ball over the goal line to complete a 24-yard play with 1:47 left in the first half.

“The play gets called in the huddle and you think, ‘all right, what am I going to leave here?’ “ said Schick, who was 5 of 8 for 105 yards and sat out the second half. “And our guys are just talented – they get open for me. It makes my job a lot easier. There's an open guy running down the field that I can go to.”

The Raiders forced a fumble on the Vengeance's next series and kicker Brady Wodack made a 37-yard field goal as the clock expired in the first half and the Raiders led 24-0.

Wodack, in his second season as kicker and punter for the Raiders, made all of his kicks Saturday, going 8 for 8 on extra points, and is 17 of 18 on all kicks (3 of 3 on field goals).

Rewolinski set the tone for the second half by returning the kickoff 70 yards for a touchdown. Corey Dalton took back the opening kickoff last week against Burlington. “Oh yeah, we got a good thing going on,” said Rewolinski, who followed the blocking scheme to perfection, starting down the sideline and cutting back over the middle to take it to the house. “You’ve got that wall and it’s hard to miss. Going up that sideline, you see Raiders players just walling up. I mean, they’re making it happen. All those touchdowns come from the blockers. You can cut back, too, on that.”

Brian Erickson, who moved from linebackers coach last year to replace now-team president Geoff Schick as Raiders offensive coordinator, said the offense still has some work to do despite the successes in the first two games. “We’re just looking to try different things,” Erickson said. “We study the film, look at the defense and see what we’re up against. We scripted the first six plays, we got through two of them and had a touchdown. So it’s kind of nice when you only have to run two plays to get a score. But we knew what to set up. We knew how to set them up. It was basically just execution. The one series we died on, we just lack the communications, and that’s what we’re trying to work through with these preseason games, get the kids communicating, talking to each other, and seeing what everybody can do.”

Raiders cement win in second half

In the second half, the defense set up the offense for short drives by creating turnovers or just playing impressive defense. Dalton intercepted Smith after a near safety, setting up a 25-yard touchdown run by Ricky Lollis to make it 38-0, and the Vengeance went three-and-out at their own 37-yard line to set up a two-play drive that featured a nifty escape by backup quarterback Mitch Farr to find Dillon Flores for a 24-yard gain, and a 13-yard TD run by Nate McKenzie for a 45-0 lead.

An 87-yard interception return by Wyatt Savarino set up a Travis Hayes 3-yard run, and the final score of the game by Burton was reminiscent of a play by former Green Bay Packers’ linebacker Clay Matthews in 2009.

Burton pulled the ball out of the hands of the Vengeance returner and ran 18 yards to the end zone, like Matthews did when he yanked the ball out of the arms of Minnesota Vikings’ running back Adrian Peterson and scored.

Raiders defensive coordinator Pete Deates said the focus in the half was to get as many new players as possible into the game to help evaluate talent at game speed. “We’re just trying to work on our base stuff,” Deates said. “We have so many new guys that we’ve got to try to see what everybody has, so it was nice this week to get extra guys in. All I tell them at the beginning of the game is we do this because we want to have fun, and the only way to have fun is by, you know, beating the other team.”

Schick was more succinct in his assessment of the defense. “They’re amazing – we know we have the best defense in the country and they make our jobs (on offense) a lot easier.”

Linebacker Gary Young Jr. had another monster game on defense with eight solo and five assisted tackles, two for loss, and Hall had eight total tackles. The defense held the Vengeance to 86 total yards.

Defense shows promise despite lopsided score

Raiders coach Wilbert Kennedy will be tweaking things on both sides of the ball to help eliminate Saturday's mistakes, which included his players not following the rule of staying behind the white line on their bench. The Raiders received a warning about the infraction, followed by Kennedy reading his team the riot act.

"Yeah, that was one thing," Kennedy said. "That's a broken record, but that's just lack of discipline, and we're going to fix that (at practice) Wednesday night. They'll learn through running to stay off the side of the field so we don't get a penalty. It seems like there's a lot of guys who are showing some pretty good stuff out here. We have a lot of talented young men. It's a matter of integrating them all together with the guys who have been here, especially for those new guys. You want to find that blend. We have a week (without a game) to get some things tweaked."

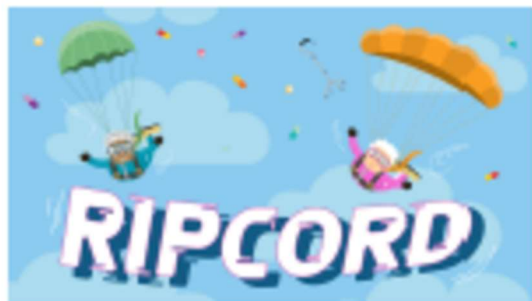
