And keep your eyes open for information on NATIONAL competitions, if our Raiders bring home the MWUF title next week!

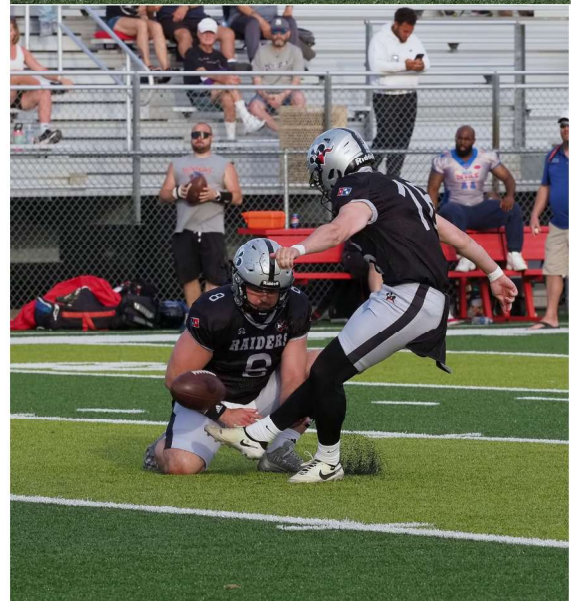

Racine Raiders clinch top seed in MWUFL Playoffs with 39-12 win at Sheboygan County

Raiders complete unbeaten regular season with dominant win

The Racine Raiders did exactly what they needed to do Saturday night:

- Win their road game against the Sheboygan County SaberCats?
 - Check.
- Score at least three points in the victory?
 - Check.
- Get another great game from their defense?
 - Check.
- Earn the No. 1 overall seed for the Mid-West United Football League playoffs and a first-round bye?
 - Check and check.

The Raiders' defense set up their first two touchdowns and a special teams blunder by the SaberCats set up a third score, and the Raiders went on to beat the SaberCats 39-12 at Taylor Memorial Field on the campus of Lakeland University in Plymouth.

In addition to an unbeaten regular season, the victory gave the Raiders (11-0, 8-0 MWUF) the No. 1 seed in the MWUF playoffs. The St. Paul Pioneers finished with the same record, but the Raiders scored more points in league play — the Raiders needed to score at least four points to do so — to break the tie and relegate the Pioneers to the No. 2 seed.

The Raiders will play the lowest remaining seed of the other four MWUF playoff teams on Aug. 8 at Horlick Field. The SaberCats, who reached a national title game last year, finished 8-4 (4-4 MWUF) and missed the playoffs.

Just four weeks ago, on June 27, the SaberCats led 16-14 in the fourth quarter at Horlick Field before the Raiders drove 46 yards to Sheboygan County's 5-yard line and Brady Wodack kicked a go-ahead 22-yard field goal. Quan Jackson then intercepted a SaberCats pass to seal the Raiders' 17-16 victory.

This time, the defense rose to the occasion early against SaberCats standout quarterback Justin Billiot. A pass interference call against the Raiders on third down and 16 allowed the SaberCats to enter Raiders' territory, but they couldn't convert on fourth and 12.

On the first play of the SaberCats' next possession, Billiot's pass was tipped by cornerback Corey Dalton and intercepted by safety Channing Schultz, making his first appearance in several games. He returned the ball to the SaberCats' 12-yard line to set up the Raiders' first score; Billiot also hurt his ankle on the play.

Rashawn Herron scored three plays later on a play that could have been a disaster. Quarterback Sawyer Schick bobbled the snap, but Herron grabbed the ball off his hands and spun into the end zone from two yards. The extra point missed and it was 6-0 Raiders.



Billiot came back in for the SaberCats' next series, but he was obviously less mobile. It showed as his first pass was again tipped and intercepted by linebacker Gary Young Jr., and the Raiders had the ball at Sheboygan County's 35.

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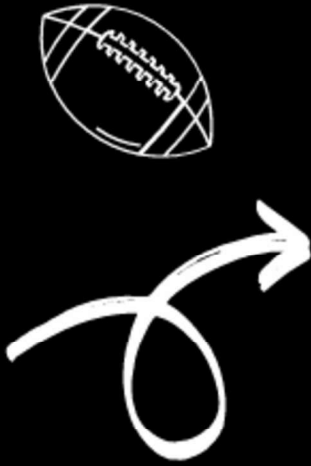
Another bad snap on first down that Schick fell on lost 10 yards, then an offside call on the SaberCats got five yards back. On the next play, Ricky Lollis took the ball from the 40 toward the left sideline, then avoided several defenders and cut across the field and ran to the end zone. The two-point run failed and it was 12-0 after the first quarter.

The Raiders got a first down on a fake punt on their first series of the second quarter, but it was called back for an illegal formation. The SaberCats went three-and-out as Billiot continued to struggle and the Raiders got the ball back.

They were held to a three-and-out, but the SaberCats helped out the Raiders. As Wodack's punt rolled downfield, returner Josh Yahsha touched the ball and the Raiders' Jashon Foster recovered the muff on the 18-yard line.

Schick hit receiver Bubba Rewolinski twice to get a first down on the 5, and Lollis took it from there for his second rushing touchdown of the game on just two attempts.

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But he wasn't done.

Midway through the third quarter, after the defense stopped the SaberCats on fourth down in their own territory, Schick hit Lollis for a 38-yard touchdown pass on third-and-18 to put the Raiders ahead 32-0. Lollis touched the ball four times in the game — he had three runs for 51 yards — and scored three touchdowns.

Tom Benko scored on a 3-yard run with 18 seconds left in the first half to give the Raiders a 25-0 halftime lead. Miles Gallagher caught two passes for 65 yards on the drive to set up the score.

Early in the fourth quarter, Billiot, who was injured again, was finally taken out of the game and replaced by Jerome Collins Jr. He immediately helped get the SaberCats' offense in gear, leading a drive that culminated in a 21-yard scoring pass to Yahsha to make it 32-6.

However, the Raiders had an answer on the ensuing drive when veteran running back Howard Triplett ran 38 yards down the right sideline for a touchdown, breaking two tackles along the way. It was his 79th career rushing touchdown and put the Raiders up 39-6.

Collins engineered another drive midway through the fourth quarter and hit Jalonzo Jackson on a 15-yard touchdown pass to make it 39-12.

The SaberCats are the only team to score more than one touchdown against the Raiders this season, and they scored twice in each meeting.

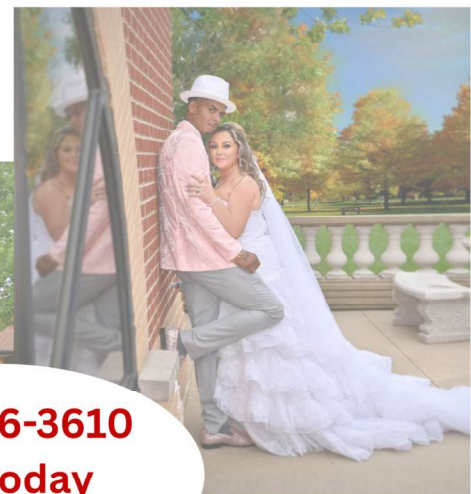
Young had seven solo tackles and four assists in addition to his interception and Thomas Burton had five solos and one assist. The defense held the SaberCats to just 51 yards rushing. Schick went 11 of 18 for 154 yards and a rating of 107.2, and Wodack averaged 48.8 yards on four punts, with a long of 64
