SUMMER STARTS HERE

The landscape of semi-pro football has changed over the last seven decades. Part of that change has included the start date of the season moving up, up some more, and up even more. The Racine Raiders season used to start in late-June or even later. Due to schools adding activities, the proliferation of turf fields, and other factors, the Raiders season starts tonight, May 14th. The earlier start date has been trending for decades now.

Still, fans come to a game in late-July or August, not realizing they're coming at the end of the season now. Board members, coaches, players, and volunteers get the annual questions from these fans of, "When did your season start?"

This year, the Racine Raiders deployed two different marketing slogans to help fans realize that the season is starting earlier each year. The two slogans included "Saturday. Summer. Football." and "Summer Starts Here." The slogans were plastered across social media, electronic billboards, and digital and print advertisements.

"We hope that we raised awareness that our season has moved from a summer/fall season to a spring/ summer season," said Vice President of Marketing Don Wadewitz. "Fans became so accustomed to the later season but other teams in our league and in the region have a difficult time getting fields when the season starts later in the year."

The latest trend in semi-pro football has been a real challenge for a team like the Raiders who rely entirely on volunteers to put on the spectacle you see every week at Historic Horlick Athletic Field. Every member of the organization gives of their time and talents - coaches, players, support staff, concessions staff, broadcast crew, equipment team, dance and cheer team, and board of directors - to help make our community a better place to live.

That's hundreds of people invested in the Racine community and one of the key reasons we call ourselves "Your Hometown Team." You'd be hard-pressed to find another organization that's able to pull together that many people with one vested interest. Yet, the Racine Raiders do it every single week.

JOE GARCIA III BROUGHT IT HOME

Joe Garcia III had that special talent at a young age. Racine Raiders board president Matt Nelson helped coach a young Garcia and often talks about how him and the other coaches knew there was something special about him.

Opposing coaches that had to try and limit what he could do against their team even talked of having the potential to play in the National Football League. While that hasn't been the outcome for Garcia, he got a chance to play collegiately at Highland Community College before returning home to Racine.

Prior to last season, Joe's dad pushed him to tryout for the Racine Raiders. The younger Garcia took the urging from his dad and came to a tryout and made the team. As the old saying goes, "the rest is history." Garcia had an amazing rookie campaign but more on that later.

During preseason practices, Garcia's dad died in a motorcycle accident. The younger Garcia had to reflect and decide what he was going to do. He decided to honor his dad by continuing to play football with the Raiders.

"I remember the game at the Leyden Lions," says Raiders broadcaster Don Wadewitz. "I'm walking on the field and the entire Lions defense is trying to figure out who number four was because nobody was wearing their jerseys yet."

Garcia finished the season with a team-leading 47 receptions for 715 yards. His eight receiving touchdowns tied for the team lead with Jordan Payne, a former NCAA Division 1 receiver that got looks from the National Football League and Canadian Football League.



Garcia seemed to come up with the big play whenever the Raiders needed it, including the game-winning punt return in overtime at the Lincoln-Way Patriots on August 14.

For his efforts, Garcia earned rookie of the year, offensive player of the year, and special teams player of the year from the MidStates Football League. He also earned several accolades from the Raiders and was a first-team all-league selection.

So, what's left for Garcia in 2022 with all that hardware he brought home after last season?

"Coming off of those rewards into my second year, it really puts a chip on my shoulder knowing other teams know how well I played my first year and that number four is going to be ready to come each and every game this year," says Garcia. "Coming into this year, I have to ease my mind and let the game of football come to me. I just want to play team football and win."



The members of the Black Top Crew are among the first to arrive at Historic Horlick Athletic Field and the last to wrap up their duties. They take care of much of the game day setup and tear down. They set up all of the tables and chairs for the 50/50 raffle, yearbook sales, and any Raiders "Major Sponsors" at the game. They take care of setting up the new R.J.'s Kids Area and the games that go with it. They also set up the Eastside beer tent and cooler, pregame player tunnel, and postgame meal equipment and beverage preparations. They also take care of the presentation for the United Commercial Travelers bike giveaway, hang the retired number and national championship flags, and much more.
