RAIDERS HOPING FOR HOLIDAY REBOUND

The Racine Raiders have suffered two close losses in MidStates Football League play this year and hope to navigate their up-and-down season back on course against the Grand Rapids Seminoles tonight.

Actually, the Grand Rapids Seminoles don't exist. The Raiders opponent tonight still uses the team name but the team is really a combination of semi-pro players from the Grand Rapids, Michigan area and other players that are looking to get added film to help them play college or professional football at some level.

This is the first game this amalgamation of players has played together this season so the Raiders coaches and players have no idea what to expect. It'll be an opportunity to focus on what the Raiders think they do best and execute that plan, hopefully setting them up for the final run through the MSFL gauntlet.

Perhaps even better news for the Raiders is it looks like they'll be able to have a week off on July 9 with the Leyden Lions folding a couple of weeks ago. General Manager Robbie Harrington has been unable to secure an opponent for the Raiders for what was scheduled to be a road game. The potential off-week will allow the team to assess where they are and get healthy, which has been an issue already.

Last week, the Raiders had just three healthy defensive linemen and five healthy offensive linemen available. Jordan Baker-Gallagher ended up filling in at defensive tackle and Dan Kant-Hull, who has played on both sides of the line in his Raiders career, played the entire game on offense and even took a couple of snaps on defense when Baker-Gallagher had to exit the game for a couple of plays.

The linebacker crew has been a bit thin as well but rookie Garrett Foldy, featured in tonight's Raider Report, has played very well starting at middle linebacker and outside linebacker the past two weeks.

After July 9, the Raiders have just one home game in league play the rest of the season, July 16 against the Illinois Cowboys who toppled the Raiders in Illinois in the first week of MSFL play, 14-12. The Raiders are currently in a tie for third place in the MSFL and need to get ahead of the Cowboys if they want to host a home playoff game.

While the MSFL only boasts five teams, no game between the remaining teams has been decided by more than a touchdown so the stretch run should be an exciting one in the MSFL!



STEPPING RIGHT INTO THE FOLD(Y)

It's not often a player joins the Racine Raiders during the season and then finds themselves starting just a week later. That was linebacker Garrett Foldy's experience, however. With the Raiders short on linebackers, Foldy stepped in to start at middle linebacker and then outside linebacker over the past two weeks. Not bad for a player who graduated from Union Grove High School in December, 2021 and didn't play college football.

"I was going to play college football but it didn't fit my career path," says Foldy. "I was going to be done (playing football) after high school."

He knew Raiders offensive line coach Vinnie Scacco who started talking to him about playing for the Raiders. Scacco persisted and finally was able to convince Foldy to come play for the Raiders.

"I was worried that I was too young," remarks Foldy.
"He told me that I definitely could handle it."



Foldy played linebacker and running back in high school. Foldy says he was given the choice of where he wanted to play and chose linebacker because there was more opportunity for playing time at the position.

Foldy had never been to a Raiders game until he played in his first one a few weeks ago. He knew about the Raiders through the coaching staff at Union Grove High School which features former Raiders like head coach Craig McClelland along with Chad and Dusty Svendsen and Connor Flannery.

"I never knew how big the fan base was, the speed of the game, or anything like that," says Foldy.

Foldy, who at five-foot, ten-inches and 190 pounds would be considered undersized for a linebacker at this level, says getting used to the size of the players he was going up against and the speed of the game took a little getting used to.

"For most of my life, I've been the biggest dude but coming here there's dudes that are way bigger than me" he chuckles. "I can't do anything about it if they want to get to me so I have to be smarter so I don't end up where the big guys are."

When he was finally convinced to play by Scacco, Foldy says he set a goal to be the key cog on defense like he was in high school. He's been working with the coaches and captain Justin Benko to learn to call the plays on defense.

Foldy says he plans to around for awhile now that he's gotten a taste of Raiders football.

"I plan to definitely keep playing," he says. "It's a good mix of competitive and fun."

Foldy owns his own landscaping business and says he doesn't have time for much outside of being a business owner, the Raiders, and working out.
