# SIX JOIN HALL OF FAME

#### SAM D'ALIE, #3, WIDE RECEIVER

Sam D'Alie is a Racine native and a graduate of Horlick High School where he was a first team All-State wide receiver. He joined the Racine Raiders in 2003 and played 12 years, setting several receiving records. In 2005, he earned Minor League Football News Offensive Player of the Year after he caught 25 passes for nearly 1,000 yards and 15 touchdowns.

This gave him the opportunity at NFL workouts which then led to a nine-year career of arena football. In his 12 years with the Raiders, Sam not only played both sides of the ball, but every position, even kicker and offensive line, after he "bribed coach Kennedy" during his last year.

Sam's greatest catch was his wife Britani. They have been married for nearly 11 years and have 5 children. First and foremost, he gives all the glory to God. Since hanging up his helmet, he has devoted his life to sharing the Gospel and being the hands and feet of Jesus. He would like to thank his family for their endless support. Sam is humbled to receive this honor knowing that without a play being called or a pass being thrown, none of this would be possible. It is with deep gratitude to the numerous coaches and players that impacted his career, that he accepts this award.

#### CHU GRAHAM, #37, CORNERBACK

Graham's four years (1987-1990) at cornerback with the Raiders was short but impactful. He helped lead a stellar defense and played in four league championship games. The Raiders won a national title in 1988 and the historic world title in 1989.

Graham led the Raiders with eight interceptions in 1987 and nine picks in 1988.

"I always believed that practice made you perfect, said Graham. "I think in four seasons I missed maybe two practices."

Graham never missed a game, "not even Statesville prison games."

"I took winning seriously and losing was like a death to me," he says. "I loved playing in front of our fans and will never forget the chants from the crowd whenever I made a big play - 'Chu Chu, eat 'em up, eat 'em up!"

Graham proved to be a playmaker and his teammates and coaches knew they could count on him in clutch moments.

"For me, the bigger the game, the hungrier I was to play in it," he states. "God bless Racine Raiders fans! To my coaches and teammates - much respect and mad love!!!"

# GARY GRIFFIN, #1, QUARTERBACK, WIDE RECEIVER, DEFENSIVE BACK

A Concordia University grad, Griffin came to the Raiders after being released by the New Orleans Saints and spending a season with the Lake County Vikings.

Gary played safety where he was a multiple time All-League and All-American selection. He made the move to wide receiver where he was also All-League and All-American. Gary finished his career as a quarterback where he was a multiple All-League selection and a two-time All-American.

Griffin scored a rushing and receiving touchdown and threw a touchdown in the same game twice! He finished his 19-year career with:

- 63 defensive interceptions
- 109 touchdowns scored
- 221 passing touchdowns

Gary now works as a high school administrator and has been a long time head high school football coach at Milwaukee Bay View and Rockford East.

Griffin is in the Concordia University, Minor League Football, and American Football Association Semi-Pro Football Halls of Fame.

#### DEB HART, VOLUNTEER

Peter has been a sportswriter for The Journal Times since August 16, 1979, when current Raiders coach Wilbert Kennedy was 12 years old.

He first covered the Raiders in 1983, when the organization was known as the Gladiators, and remembers Charlie Bliss throwing touchdown passes at a record pace during a national championship season that summer. Peter was named the Minor League Football Writer of the Year that season.

His memories of covering this organization are too numerous to count and he continues to be deeply impressed by the Raiders' commitment to excellence.

#### MATT SCHOENEMAN, OFFENSIVE LINE

Matt Schoeneman is married to Robyn and together they have two daughters, Aubrey and Eiley. Matt attended and played football at Waukesha South High School before attending and playing football at Carthage College.

Matt is currently an Elementary and Middle School Special Education Teacher at Lac du Flambeau School. He has lived in Mercer, Wis. for the past 15 years.

Matt began to play in 1997 and ended his career with the Racine Raiders in 2004. Matt enjoyed success as player, coach, and board member.

While playing center, Matt earned multiple All Conference and national accolades for his play. His favorite Raiders memory is winning the 2001 National Championship at home in front of the Raider Nation.

"Thank you to all those that supported, coached, and influenced my playing career and life after football," says Matt.

# HALL OF FAME CELEBRATES 20 YEARS

The Racine Raiders had to do something in 2002. Bob Milkie retired for the second time the year before. He had given 45 years to the Gladiators and Raiders. Milkie was one of the winningest coaches in semi-pro football history and he literally helped rescue the team from ruin.

So, what does the team do? They set up a Racine Raiders Hall of Fame and they make Mr. Raider, Bob Milkie, the first and only member in the hall's inaugural year.

With the addition of the six newest members today, 68 people - men and women - are now part of the Racine Raiders Hall of Fame. Some members are iconic players. Others were great coaches. A bunch served in the shadows as volunteers or board members. Some, like Peter Jackel, never officially were with the team but their support was tremendous and the organization felt they deserved special recognition to show the role they played in this one-of-a-kind organization.

That's 68 people for a team with a 69-year history. That's not even one person for each year of existence, making the Raiders Hall of Fame perhaps the most exclusive hall of fame in all of sports. By comparison, there are 354 members in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame boasts 164 members over the 101 years of existence.

The club is exclusive. The history is undenialable. The uniqueness is amazing. Congrats to the members of our exclusive Hall.
